Big Sioux River Project Report by Jaelynn Dreckman:

SRAM & RAM: Working on a Working Land Easement Contract along the Big Sioux River; working on a Livestock Water Development; Many producers reaching out about SRAM/RAM

EQIP/RCPP: No update

OTHER RELATED ITEMS: Tanner Clausen starts on May 18th; Dreckman will help with the Big Sioux Empire Water Festival in Brookings on May 12th

Urban Educator Report by Alina Krone-Hedman:

OUTREACH: Branch Out! Earth and Arbor Day Festival – April 24th. Attended by approximately 300 during 2 hours. Made bookmarks, gave out 40 MCD brochures and other handouts (NACD Stewardship Week materials, tree planting tips native grass information, woody encroachment information, pollinator information). **Party for the Planet** – April 25th at Outdoor Campus with approximately 200 people walking through during the 4 hours. Had a game, gave out 15 MCD brochures, and pollinator handouts.

CITY PARTNERSHIP: Prairie and Pollinator Program – Sales are going well and much interest in kits right now. **Other**

Demonstration Areas: Checking into making Galway Park Garden into just a pollinator garden instead of rain garden due to maintenance and function concerns. Waiting for grant for making full plan for urban garden area. **GRANTS/FUNDING**

PARTNERSHIPS: NACD Technical Assistance Grant - still waiting to hear on funding status of next grant cycle. Continuing

to make plans for outreach and training for current grant cycle. **OTHER: Dewey C. Gevik Outdoor Learning Area** – Continuing to work on site improvements. Kiosk is in place and have sent Soil Health Coalition further information for improving kiosk. Signs are designed and waiting to hear feedback/find out about printing. **Conversations and Conservation:** Planning next event at Fernson Brewery, date to be determined after Memorial Day. All those who are affiliated with or work in conservation are welcome.

Public Comment Time – 15 minutes – Denny Brunsting introduced himself to the board. He works part-time for the district in the spring and is interested in being an advisor to the board.

Update from Supervisors – Entenman helped with the **Party for the Planet**, which had 200+ participants and the **Earth Day Clean-up Event**, which had 500 participants and removed 2 ½ tons of trash. **Bonander** mentioned that he will be participating in a County Commission Candidate Forum at the Scheels Training Room on May 18th at 6:30 p.m.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Service Report (bio-solids, tree planting, grass planting, Gevik Site)

Bio-solids: No activity. No soil sampling until late summer/fall. **Trees:** 45 acres to plant (15 acres completed). **Grass:** Going well; should be done by May 21st. **Gevik Site:** Meeting scheduled about unauthorized ATV driver issues.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Future Ideas for District Services

Parker led discussion about possible services that the district could add to their offerings. He would like to get a bio-degradable fabric to sell. Other services mentioned were watering and drip line set-ups, growing midsize trees, horse farm pasture aerating, tree moving, grinding tree stumps, soil sampling, overseeding, and compost supply. The projects that could be done using a wide range of skid-steer loader attachments should be investigated. Finding labor may be the biggest issue with all these items.
